More than 7,000 unpaid AARP-trained individuals instruct, administer and promote the AARP course in local communities nationwide.* As an AARP Driver Safety volunteer, you’ll feel good knowing you’re raising the level of confidence behind the wheel while making your community a safer place.

AARP Driver Safety Positions Available:

Instructors: Give back to your community with a commitment to teach at least 3 classes a year. Organize, promote, and conduct AARP Driver Safety classroom courses at your local community center, library, hospital or senior center.

Marketing Specialists: Promote AARP Driver Safety within your state and local community. Locate potential state-wide classroom host sites, identify publicity or promotion opportunities and coordinate exhibits at statewide events.

Coordinators: Manage AARP Driver Safety in a district, state or region. Recruit and supervise instructors, complete instructor reviews, plan and conduct instructor workshops, promote the program, and work with local sponsors.

*All volunteers are reimbursed for approved out-of-pocket expenses, such as mileage, parking, postage, long-distance phone calls, and basic supplies.
