



AARP Driver Safety Program



The AARP Driver Safety Program is the nation's first and largest classroom driver safety course designed especially for drivers age 50 and older to help people live more independently as they age. Since the program's inception in 1979, over 13 million participants have completed the AARP course.



The AARP Driver Safety Program course covers the latest rules of the road, defensive driving techniques, and how to operate a vehicle more safely in today's increasingly challenging driving environment. The course also reviews the normal aging process and how to make adjustments to accommodate common age-related changes in vision, hearing and reaction time. Topics like how to minimize the effects of dangerous blind spots and navigating busy intersections are also covered.

AARP Driver Safety Program Classroom Course

The AARP classroom course offers weekday, evening, and weekend courses at many convenient locations nationwide. Courses are available in Spanish in some locations. Participants are charged a minimal fee, and there are no tests.



In 36 states and the District of Columbia, classroom course participants may be eligible to receive a state mandated, multi-year discount on their auto insurance premiums. Voluntary discounts are offered in select states. Please consult your insurance agent for further details.

Driver Safety Online Course

Enjoy learning from the comfort of your own home? Now you can take the same course AARP offers in the classroom in the comfort of your home, at your own pace, using your home computer. The online course is self-paced and interactive. Participants can choose to complete the course in one sitting or they may complete the course at their convenience—logging in and out of the course as their schedule allows.

In some states, separate rules may apply to online driver improvement courses. Check with your insurance company before taking the online course to see if you may be eligible for a discount.

What else do I need to know and how do I sign up?

- Though geared for drivers age 50 and older, the course is open to people of any age.
- AARP membership is not required to take the course.
- There is no test to pass.
